ARCHIVISTS FOR CONGREGATIONS OF WOMEN RELIGIOUS

DEATH CLAIMS NOTED HISTORIAN

The worlds of archives and history lost a true friend and dedicated worker when death came to Sister Evangeline Thomas on December 30, 1990, while visiting relatives in Washington, D.C. during the Christmas holidays.



A member of the Sisters of St. Joseph of Concordia, Kansas, Sister Evangeline was born on December 16, 1903 in Carbondale, Pennsylvania, entered the congregation in 1921, and earned her masters and doctoral degrees in history from Catholic University of America in 1934 and 1936. She served as chairwoman of the history department at Marymount College, Salina, Kansas for 32 years and was involved with many other activities on the college campus and in Salina.

In 1948, Sister Evangeline wrote and published her major history of the Concordia Congregation titled FOOTPRINTS ON THE FRONTIER. Msgr. John Tracy Ellis, the Catholic historian, observed, "If every religious community in the country were to have as fine a volume as this,

the history of our religious orders would be very well served."

From 1976 through 1983, Sister Evangeline directed a national archives project for the Leadership Conference of Women Religious. The fruit of that work was the publication of WOMEN RELIGIOUS HISTORY SOURCES: A GUIDE TO COLLEC-TIONS OF MANUSCRIPTS AND ARCHIVES IN THE UNITED STATES. In this book she stated, "The women religious have made a notable and varied contribution that has touch virtually every aspect of American life over nearly two centuries. These women represent a heritage that should not be lost or forgotten. That heritage should be enlarged, cultivated and woven into the fabric of American religious and social history in a way that will endure."

At the time of her death Sister Evangeline was involved in a comprehensive study of the social, cultural and religious impact of the Sisters of St. Joseph in North America which was being sponsored by the CSJ Federation.

ACWR COMMITTEE FORMED

The Feast of the Immaculate Conception dawned bright and clear in Wichita, Kansas on December 8, 1990, as members of either the Ad Hoc Committee or the newly formed Task Force of the Archivists for Congregations of Women Religious (ACWR) came together at Mount St. Mary's Convent to finalize the organizational model for ACWR and to formulate action plans for 1991.

When the work of the day was completed, those present voted to merge the two committees into one which is now called ACWR Committee with Sister Rosalie McQuaide as chairperson.

WITH THE WORKING TITLE OF <u>RELIGION AND SOCIAL CHANGE: THE IMPACT</u> OF <u>SISTERS OF ST.
